**EMPOWERING FARMERS AND UNITING NEIGHBORS IN RWANDA**: Peace and Development Network (PDN) and other Rwandan organizations train farmers in conservation agriculture through farmer field schools. Each farmer trained in turn trains five other local farmers. Farmers receive a female goat or sheep to get manure and to make money for other basic family needs, such as their children's education. If that animal has offspring, they share the firstborn with a neighbor and can keep or sell the rest. \$40 buys one goat or one sheep. \$80 buys two animals for two farmers. Farming Tools for Women in Chad: MCC partner Bureau d'Appui aux Organisations de Base (BAOBAB) works with farmers to increase crop yields in southwest Chad and raise healthy livestock, which has helped farmers diversify their income and better cope with unpredictable growing seasons. Two to three households share farming tools such as watering cans, hoes, shovels, rakes, wheelbarrows and sprayers. In the photo to the left, female participants learn to transplant cabbage and various peppers. Women working with BAOBAB are able to earn enough money daily to provide for their families. This program supports 280 families. \$64 provides a set of farming tools for two to three families to share. Designate your gift "Chad-Food and Livelihoods" to support this project.
