TRAINING TAILORS IN SOUTH SUDAN

The Women's Empowerment Program empowers displaced women by providing tailoring and business skills trainings, along with financial support. Each year, 30 women learn how to design, size and assemble garments, and receive small sewing machines that help them start their own tailoring operations. Additionally, a revolving fund provides seed capital to 50 women each year for starting or expanding small businesses. Annet Wani (left) has completed the trainings and works making children's clothes. "I can take care of myself and send money to my children who live with my mother in a northern Ugandan refugee camp." \$150 buys a sewing machine. EARLY EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN IN LEBANON

This project, implemented by MCC partner Tahaddi, aims to improve educational outcomes each year for 55 economically and socially atrisk children (ages 3-6) from Hay el Gharbeh, an impoverished informal settlement in southern Beirut. Through a three-year bilingual (English/Arabic) pre-primary education program, children receive the social and academic skills needed for success in formal schooling.
