Excerpts from a letter from Camp Mennoscah Board of Directors:

Greetings! We are grateful for your support in the past and in the future as difficult decisions need to be made. This is an update of our current challenges: Financially the last few years, because we have tried to keep costs realistic and our budget balanced, large permanent facility needs were not addressed and wages/benefits were kept low. Tammy Duvenal Unruh was hired as Development Director to try to increase income. Although we appreciate her efforts, the board has made the difficult decision to part ways. We are grateful for Director Olivia Bartel and her willingness to step in and step up where needed. Equally challenging is the number of necessary upgrades that are long overdue at camp. The board felt strongly that a retreat center would bring in additional revenue from outside groups during our offseason. We have been blessed with both generous contributions, and volunteers willing to give of their time, but not to the extent of keeping the project moving forward. It has been a mental and physical burden to bear the weight of dwindling finances, dilapidated structures, and limited options. We seek your continued prayers and kind financial support, as Olivia and the board look at ways to keep Camp Mennoscah viable and sustainable into the future.
