## **Five Minutes of Silence**

Spend at least five minutes in silence with God each day. No phone, no agenda, no to-do list. Just space. Or repeat the beatitude: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." Silence isn't about achieving something, but about presence. Over time, these quiet moments open us to see God in new ways.
